

Year 10 Key Stage 4

Teacher Prediction

This is the teacher's prediction of the grade that the student is most likely to achieve at the end of their GCSE studies. The prediction is based upon everything that the teacher knows about the student; their work to date; their approach to the subject; the course content; and the performance of similar students historically at Tring School.

EPG - Expected Progress Grade at the end of Year 11

This is the aspirational grade the student should be able to achieve at the end of their Key Stage 4 studies if they fully apply themselves.

Year 10 Examination Result (Summer Term)

This is the grade that the student achieved in the Year 10 Mock Examination, taking account of any coursework or controlled assessments already completed.

Numerical Grades

Most GCSEs started by students in 2016 will be awarded a numerical grade, from 1-9, where an old grade C is approximately equivalent to a 4 and an old grade A is equivalent to a 7. Nine is the highest grade that can be awarded. A few subjects will still be awarded a letter grade as the new system is phased in.

Numerical GCSE Grades: 9, 8, 7, 6, 5, 4, 3, 2, 1, and U **Letter GCSE Grades:** A*, A, B, C, D, E, F, G and U

BTEC Grades: Distinction* (D*), Distinction (D), Merit (M), Pass (P) Level 1, and Fail (F)

The colour coding on the report compares a student's current Predicted Grade to their EP Grade.

The student is working above their EP grade
The student is working at their EP grade

The student is working one level below their EP grade

The student is working two or more levels below their EP grade



Attitude to Learning

Attitude to Learning scores are given in relation to Classwork, Homework, Behaviour and Organisation. Scores are from 1-4 for the first three categories and 2-4 for Organisation.
